Mr. President, Madam Special Rapporteur, Excellencies, Distinguished Colleagues,

The Sovereign Order of Malta congratulates the Special Rapporteur on her appointment and thanks her for the report taking stock of the achievements made by her predecessors and her vision for the future of the mandate.

We extend our deep appreciation and gratitude for the impressive work done by the previous Special Rapporteurs.

As we mark the tenth (10th) anniversary of the creation of the mandate by this Council, it is timely opportunity to reflect on the progresses made in advancing the rights of persons with disabilities, share good practices and address new challenges (such as climate change and digital transformation) to prevent violation of their human rights and exclusion from society. In this context, the practical implementation of the CRPD remains a priority.

The Order of Malta welcomes the vision report of the SR which aims at pushing forward the disability rights agenda in the SDGs, at the U.N. and in cooperation with all stakeholders, which must also include faith-based organisations. In addressing the priorities mentioned in the report approach, it is indeed crucial to take into account the fundamental role of family, the active participation and inclusion of persons with disabilities in decision-making processes, leading to independence and the full enjoyment of their human rights.
